THE FOREST MARKET SITUATION*

THE UNITED STATES SITUATION - The drop in construction and the decline of industrial production in the United States has been associated with a leveling off in demand for timber products during the last part of 1960. Total production of round timber products in 1960 is estimated at eleven billion cubic feet - slightly below production in 1959. Production of industrial roundwood amounted to about 9.5 billion cubic feet and fuelwood 1.5 billion cubic feet.

Stumpage prices at midyear 1960 showed a downward trend largely reflective weakness in lumber markets. Lumber production for the year amounted to about thirty-five billion board feet - about five percent below production in 1959. The West accounted for about fifty-five percent of the lumber produced, the South thirty-two percent, and the North the remaining thirteen percent. Softwoods, chiefly Douglas Fir, Southern Pine, Ponderosa Pine, Western True Firs, and Hemlock accounted for about eighty percent of total production.

Lumber imports in 1960 were estimated at 3.8 billion board feet, exports one billion board feet, and increases in stocks one billion feet. Total lumber consumption was estimated in 1960 at about eight percent below consumption in 1959.

Part of this decrease in consumption was due to the decline in construction, but part of it also reflected the continuing substitution of other materials for lumber. Since 1950, for example, per capita consumption of lumber was decreased by about twenty-four percent, while per capita consumption of competing materials such as softwood plywood has increased one hundred and fifty-six percent, building board thirty-eight percent, container board eighteen percent, and structural steel five percent.

This decline in per capita lumber consumption has occurred despite the fact that wholesale prices of most substitute materials have been rising relative to lumber. Since 1950 the wholesale price index of lumber has increased only nine percent. Meanwhile, the wholesale price of structural steel has increased sixty-five percent, structural clay products forty-seven percent, and paper board twenty-nine percent. Plywood prices, however, decreased nine percent.

Pulpwood production in 1960 was estimated at forty million cords. This represents a new production peak - nine percent above the highest reached in 1959. Softwoods, such as Southern Pine, Hemlock, Douglas Fir, Spruce, and True Fir account for about eighty percent of the pulpwood produced and hardwood twenty percent. About sixty-two percent of total pulpwood production was in the South, twenty percent in the West, and the remaining eighteen percent in the North.

Production of chipped residues obtained from sawmills and veneer mills was estimated at seven million cords - a new peak in a trend that has been sharply upward since 1944. During the last four years production of pulpwood from residues has increased about 3.5 million cords while production of round pulpwood has increased 1.3 million cords.

In the southeast roundwood pulpwood prices showed some increase in 1960. In this section of the country prices of rough pine pulpwood at local points of delivery averaged about \$16.50 per cord - about fifty cents above the average in 1959 and a dollar above in 1958.

Softwood peeler log production in 1960 was estimated at 3.6 billion board feet - about five percent more than in 1959 when 3.4 billion board feet was produced. Production of hardwood veneer logs in 1960 amounted to about 1.0 billion board feet - about the same as the annual average since 1950.

Production of other industrial roundwood products, such as cooperage logs, poles and piling, fence posts, hewnties, round mine timbers, and miscellaneous products was estimated at 740 million cubic feet in 1960. Recent trends in production have shown increases for some products, such as poles and piling, and decreases for others such as mine timbers and cooperage logs.

The consumption of Christmas trees in the United States was somewhat above forty million trees, with imports from Canada of about twelve million. Prices paid for Christmas trees on the stump varied widely, but generally range from twenty-five cents for wild trees to \$2.50 or more for plantation-grown trees, including shaped wild trees.

The national outlook for timber products over the next few years depends to a major degree on continuance of growth in gross national production, industrial production, and housing and other construction. With a high level of employment, increases in the uses of industrial wood seems likely. Since 1950 pulpwood consumption in the United States has been rising by an average of two million cords a year, and recent trends in markets and plans for increases in productive capacity suggests continued growth. Further increases in the consumption of softwood veneer logs are also expected. Lumber consumption, however, is not likely to change much until about the mid 1960's when the upsurge in births that began in the early 1940's is expected to be reflected in an increase in the formation of new households. This should have a favorable effect on residential construction and lumber consumption.

THE NEW HAMPSHIRE SITUATION - The national drop in demand for forest products is reflected in the softening in prices paid for stumpage in New Hampshire during the last part of 1960 and during the early weeks of 1961. Stumpage prices for logs are down except for some quality stumpage in special demand. There has been a spotty increase in the demand for hardwood stumpage for logs during 1960, especially in southern New Hampshire. Increasing numbers of buyers have become interested in hardwood stumpage to be used for pallets, squares, and other dimension stock. Species such as soft maple, red oak, and elm stumpage has a market in some sections of the state. There remains a good demand for quality white pine stumpage at attractive prices. The market for poor quality pine stumpage is not active. The demand for all kinds of pulpwood is at a low ebb and it appears that this situation will exist for some time.

Prices paid for pulpwood are lower than one year ago. In some sections there has been an active market for poles and piling. The owners of quality Christmas tree stumpage received a good price for Christmas trees, especially those individuals who had contact with established outlets. There was some over production of Christmas trees by those producers who did not have predetermined markets. The quantity of Christmas tree brush sold at good prices, and sales increased over the previous year.

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR SELLING

New Hampshire woodland owners who plan to sell stumpage, logs, pulpwood, and other forest products are urged to consider the following recommendations before selling:

- 1. Find out from buyers of stumpage, logs, pulpwood, and other forest products the prices they offer in order that you may take advantage of the best market. Compare the local prices with those quoted from other sections of the state.
- 2. Before selling, consult your neighbors who have recently sold timber and use their experience as a guide. Ask your County Forester. In many instances, failure to do this has resulted in the woodland owner not getting full value of the product.
- 3. Thoroughly investigate all local timber requirements and prices since in many cases local markets pay better prices than outside markets because of the saving of transportation charges.
- 4. Advertise and secure competition among outside purchasers. The expense will be small and outside buyers will thus learn of chances to bid on timber in competition with local buyers.
- 5. Secure bids whenever possible, both by the lump sum sale based on closely estimated volume and by log scale measure. A choice is thus offered and a more profitable form of bid can be accepted.
- 6. Consider the responsibility of the prospective purchaser before making the sale in order to avoid slow payment, costly collections, and losses.
- 7. When there is quality timber to market, these trees are worth more than the average or poor-quality trees. Be sure the buyer takes the factor of tree quality into consideration when offering you a price for stumpage.
- 8. Remember that standing timber usually increases in value and generally can be sold at any time. The owner, therefore, is not obliged to place his product on the market, if the price offered is not satisfactory. Sell only trees that should be cut. These trees should be marked by the owner or his agent with the help and advice of a qualified forester. Reliable operators will make partial cuttings by taking only the marked trees, if the owner insists.
- 9. A written timber sale agreement between buyer and seller is most important before cutting starts on a lot. Sample sale agreement forms to fit different kinds of operations can be obtained from your County Foresters.

10. Consider the possibility of retaining the services of a qualified forester to act as your agent in handling a timber sale in your behalf when you are not in the position to look after the details of a sale, such as marking the trees for cutting, negotiating a fair price for the marked trees, looking after the cutting operations, and making sure the terms of the contract or agreement are being followed. The names and addresses of Consulting Foresters that practice in New Hampshire are listed in this report.

ASSISTANCE RENDERED BY THE COUNTY FORESTER

The County Forester helps woodland owners to help themselves. Your County Forester will assist you in the examination of your woodlands and make recommendations for managing them. He will help you or your agent in marking trees for cutting in limited amounts, and advise you in the marketing of forest products.

There are thousands of acres of young growing trees, such as pine, spruce, fir and desirable hardwood, that can be converted into desirable stands of trees, if the over-topping weed trees are cut or killed. It is profitable to prune young, fast-growing, well-formed softwoods, especially white pine with the purpose of growing quality logs that will yield clear lumber. Your County Forester can assist you in getting a forest improvement program started in your woodlands. Under the provisions of the Agricultural Conservation Program, the Federal Government shares the cost of woodland improvements and tree planting with woodland owners. Your County Forester can provide you with the information about the cost-sharing programs.

The following observation is made in New Hampshire Station Bulletin 420, "Marketing Forest Products in New Hampshire", by Lewis C. Swain and Oliver P. Wallace.

"Where foresters assisted woodland owners in the sale of their timber, this assistance shows up as higher prices obtained by the owners. The study showed that owners who obtained the advice of foresters received nearly twenty percent more in price for their stumpage as compared with those who did not obtain the advice of foresters."

The following observations are made in New Hampshire Station Bulletin 433, "Buying Practices of Wood-Using Industries in New Hampshire", by Lewis C. Swain and Oliver P. Wallace.

"Fifty-nine percent of all sawmill owners have forest land of their own. This may be taken as a stabilizing factor since it serves as a direct source of raw material and involves mill management with forest crop production."

"The average number of years in business is 22 for sawmills, 27 for other mills, and 78 for pulp and paper manufacturers."

"The principal species used are white pine and hemlock. Two-thirds of the total industry depends upon these two species. Seventy-five percent make purchases of logs, thus offering the owner an opportunity to utilize his labor and transportation facilities."

"In making stumpage purchases, 43 percent of the wood-using industries still depend upon ocular estimates. All others follow recognized measurement practices. The New Hampshire or caliper rule is used in log buying by 46 percent of the industry. Thirty percent use the International and 24 percent use some other log rule or mill tally."

"Quality requirements are indicated by price ranges quoted by some of the mill buyers. No direct reference is made to log grades. The average log size at mills sawing white pine was found to be ten feet long and 9.1 inches in diameter at the small end. Since larger logs produce higher lumber grades, the small size used in pine mills indicates scarcity in high grade lumber output. Stationary mills quote higher prices for logs than is true of portables. There is a geographic difference in prices of stumpage and logs within the State. Highest prices are paid in the two counties of Carroll and Grafton."

"No sizable area in the State lacks either forest resources or wood-using industries. The increased interest in timberland ownership by industry points out advantages which may be gained in raising forest crops. New Hampshire produces a variety of valued species for which there are large and favorable markets."

RANGE OF PRICES PAID FOR FOREST PRODUCTS, JANUARY 1961

Quality, quantity, location, logging chance, demand, and other factors affect the prices paid for stumpage, logs, pulpwood, boltwood, piling, poles, fuelwood, Christmas trees, and other forest products. The range in prices paid for stumpage and for roadside and mill deliveries is so varied that the prices quoted show a wide range. Prices can be expected to go up or down depending on the market situation and demand for certain species.
