Carroll County is the gateway between New Hampshire's lakes and mountains regions—spanning from Squam Lake and Lake Winnipesaukee in the south to the peaks of the White Mountains in the north. This past year, Extension staff helped local farmers grow their businesses by engaging in market research, advised small woodlot owners to improve their resources, helped people in recovery learn new skills with a campfire cooking class, and established 4-H STEM robotics programs in Ossipee and 3-D printing and Rube Goldberg machines in Conway. Clay Groves, Conway's Project SUCCEED director, said, "Extension helps bring innovative training to our afterschool staff who are then able to offer these new programs at all three elementary schools in Conway.
